First Reading: Acts 4.5-12 A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

The Jewish rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem,

with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, 'By what power or by what name did you do this?' Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, 'Rulers of the people and elders, if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed. let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of lesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. This Jesus is

"the stone that was rejected by you, the builders; it has become the cornerstone." There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved."

Psalm 23, R\: The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not be in want.

Second Reading: | John 3.16–24 A reading from the first letter of John.

We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us — and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? Little children, let us love, not in word or

speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God: and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him. And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

Gospel: John 10.11-18

Jesus said to the Pharisees:

'I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father.'

Sunday 28 April: Annual Parish Meetings

The 2024 Annual Meetings will take place on Sunday 28 April at 11.30am in the Church. The meetings will also be livestreamed on Zoom for observation only; those viewing online will not be able to comment or vote, regardless of eligibility. The meeting link will be sent out nearer the date.

There will be two meetings. The Annual Parish Meeting, to elect the Churchwardens, followed by the Annual Parochial Church Meeting to conduct other parish business and elections. Everyone is welcome to attend both meetings, but only those on the church electoral roll are entitled to vote. However, the Annual Parish Meeting is a public meeting so all residents in the parish who are also on the register of local government electors are also entitled to vote. We will be holding elections for the churchwardens, four members of the PCC, and two members of the Deanery Synod to serve a 2-year casual vacancy (who also serve as PCC members). Nomination forms are available at the back of the church.

Join our PCC?

St John's PCC (Parochial Church Council) is a friendly and committed group of people who work with the Vicar, clergy and staff team in promoting the whole mission of the church. Responsible for maintenance, repair and expenditure, we are the charitable trustees of the church. We have a key role in making St John's a place of faith, hope and love, with the worship we offer on Sundays spilling out into a gracious offering to our local community, loving our neighbours and challenging isolation and injustice. It is a great privilege to serve in this way, and any communicant member of the church, over the age of 16 is eligible. PCC members usually serve a term of three years, and we have around 10 meetings a year. If you would like to stand, or simply find out more, please speak to Revd Gill or a current PCC member. Women and the Church of England: 200 Years of Women's Ministry and Agency
